MOYER FARMS

In 1799 Dilman Moyer travelled by Conestoga wagon from Bucks County Pennsylvania to the Twenty area of Upper Canada, where he settled his young family on this 100 acre property.

Originally, field crops and livestock were raised for home use.

Today the property is being farmed by the seventh generation of Moyers, and as a result of a favourable combination of soil and microclimate, production has shifted to more lucrative tender fruit crops.

The Moyers were among the first growers to recognize the business potential of inviting consumers to pick their own fruit and to see how their food is grown.

They were at the forefront of a successful movement amongst growers to more directly connect with the consumer.
