**1 4357 Ontario Street Beamsville ,
FLEMING CHICKS LTD**

The site of a business that made a major contribution to the establishment of the poultry industry in Lincoln and nationwide,

**2 4310 Ontario Street Beamsville ,
Royal Bank of Canada**

Former site of the **A HARRIS FOUNDRY**, the precursor to a world-wide company that Beamsville might have had.

**3 4309 Central Avenue Beamsville
Community Care of West Niagara**

The former site of **VOSBURGH'S BLACKSMITH SHOP** that served Lincoln's farm community and also became part of Canadian hockey history.

**4 4289 Hixon Street Beamsville
Craig Budd Insurance Agency Ltd.**

Former site of **THE BEAMSVILLE BASKET AND VENEER COMPANY** which played a major role in the expansion of Lincoln's fruit and vegetable production.

**5 4845 King Street Beamsville
Providence Church**

Former site of **THE BEAMSVILLE PRESERVING COMPANY** which gave Lincoln's fruit and vegetable growers new marketing opportunities.

**6 4509 Bartlett Road Beamsville
N.M.BARTLETT INC**

The site of one of Lincoln's oldest businesses which has been critical to the success of fruit and vegetable growing worldwide.

**7 4303 Cherry Avenue Vineland
CHERRY AVENUE PICK YOUR OWN FARMS** an innovative family farm that created a new marketing system widely used in Lincoln.

**8 4230 Victoria Avenue Vineland
CHERRY LANE**
One of the most innovative farms in Lincoln that became the first to successfully solve a fruit marketing crisis.

**9 4925 Martin Road Vineland Station
MARTIN FARMS ,**
Owned by one of the farm families who pioneered a new growing system for plants that is a hallmark of Lincoln's agricultural success.

**10 4890 Victoria Avenue North Vineland
Station**

Vineland Research and Innovation Centre (the plaque is on the Ontario Government Building)
Former site of **THE HORTICULTURAL EXPERIMENTAL FARM** , one of the most influential factors in the success of agriculture in Lincoln

**11 3100 North Service Road Vineland
Station**

LAKEHOUSE RESTAURANT
The former site of the **JACOB MOYER WHARF** one of the earliest marketing ventures for Lincoln's pioneer agricultural crops.

**12 4150 Jordan Road Jordan
VINELAND GROWERS' CO-OP,**

One of the earliest examples of Lincoln farmers working together to achieve success for their industry.

⑬ 3836 Main Street Jordan

CAVE SPRING CELLARS

The former site of **JORDAN APPLE WORKS** and **JORDAN WINE COMPANY**, businesses that were leaders in the development of what has become a major agricultural success in Lincoln.

⑭ 3370 King Street Vineland

Meridian Credit Union

Formerly **NIAGARA CREDIT UNION**, a lending institution that played a critical role for Lincoln's agricultural success.

⑮ 3804 Fly Road Vineland

Private Home at corner of Fly Rd and Cherry Ave

Former site of **H KEEP'S BLACKSMITH SHOP** a business that was typical of the shops that kept farmers and their equipment operating in Lincoln.

⑯ 3814 Yonge Street Vineland

Twenty Valley Golf and Country Club

Former site of **DEAN'S MILL**, a grist and sawmill that serviced the needs of Lincoln's farmers for 66 years.

⑰ 3571 Campden Road, Campden

Smith's Water Delivery

Former site of a **MODEL T FORD SUB DEALERSHIP** that helped Lincoln's farmers survive the Great Depression.

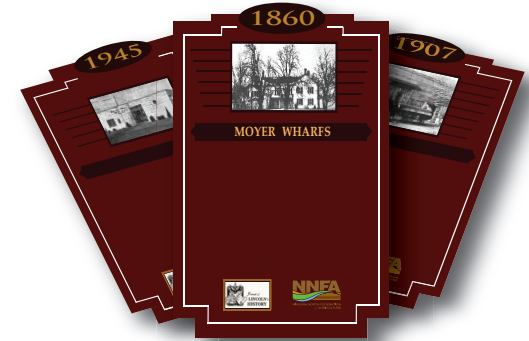
